What a multilingual site needs

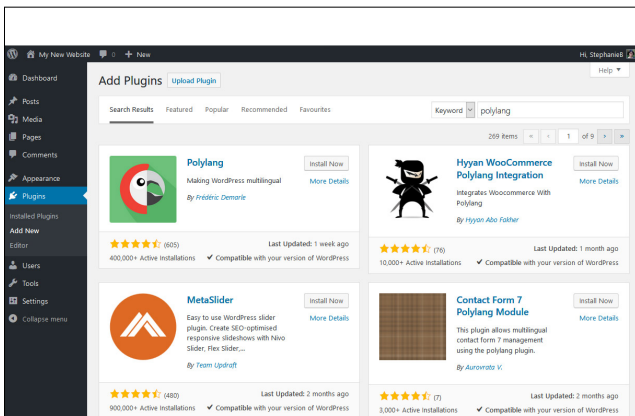
- Each page is translated (preferably by a specialist...)
- A language switcher, either in a sidebar widget or in the navigation. The switcher allows the visitor to access any page they land on on their own language
- The ability to edit permalink, categories, tags
- Integration with 3rd parties, eg Ecommerce, ACF, Yoast

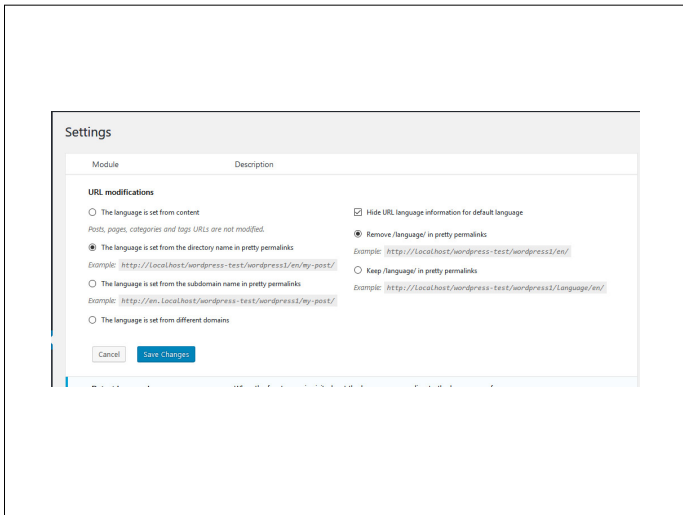
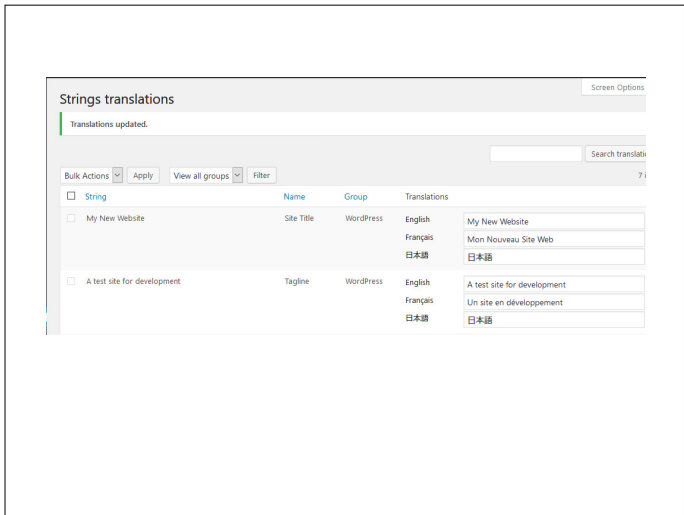
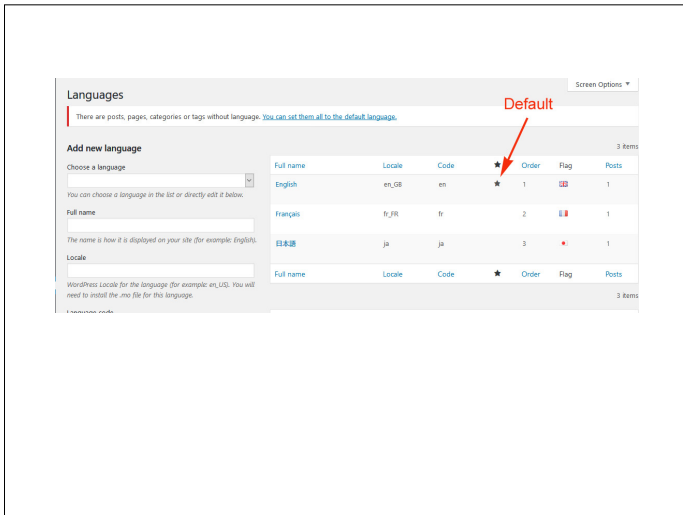
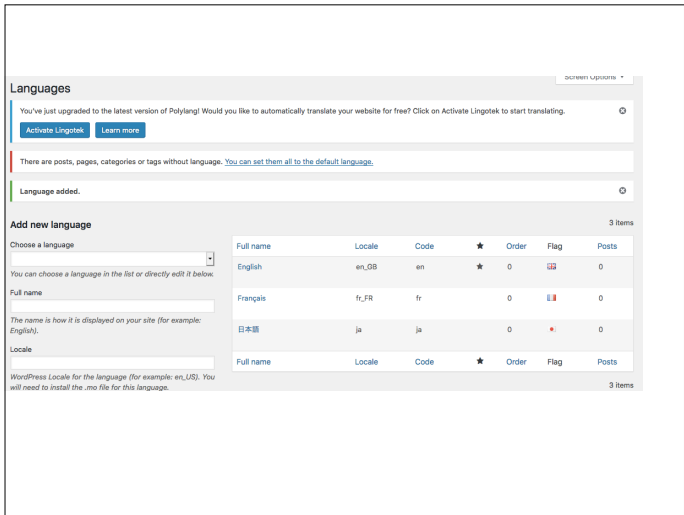
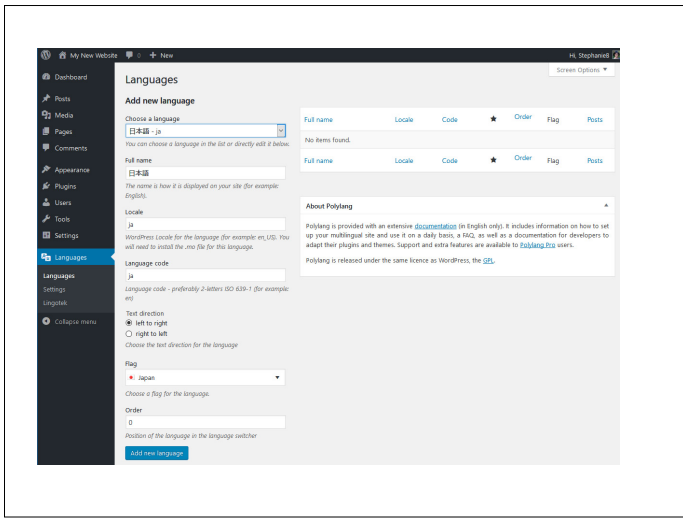
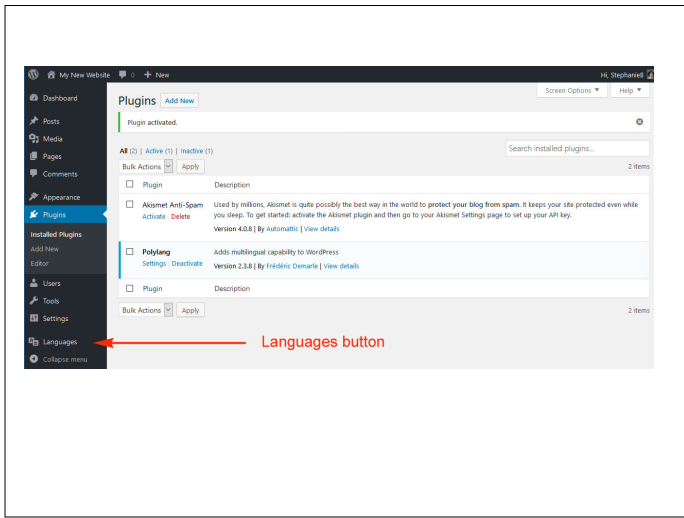

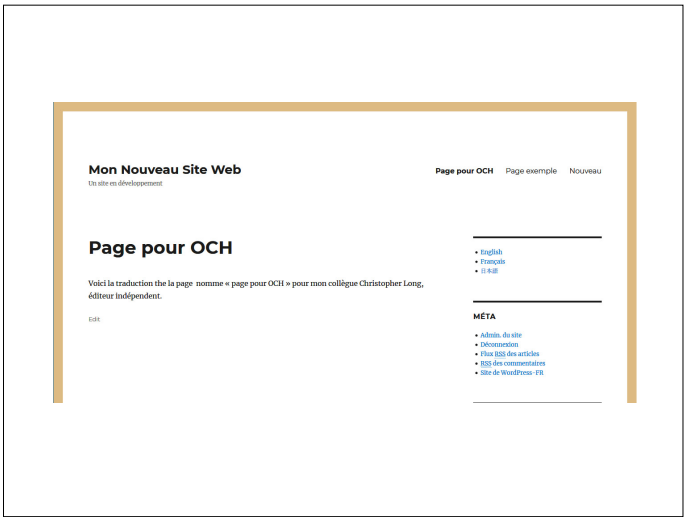
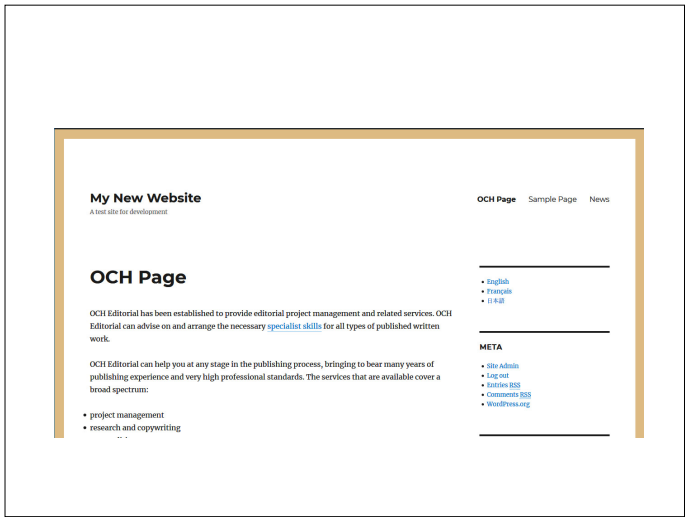
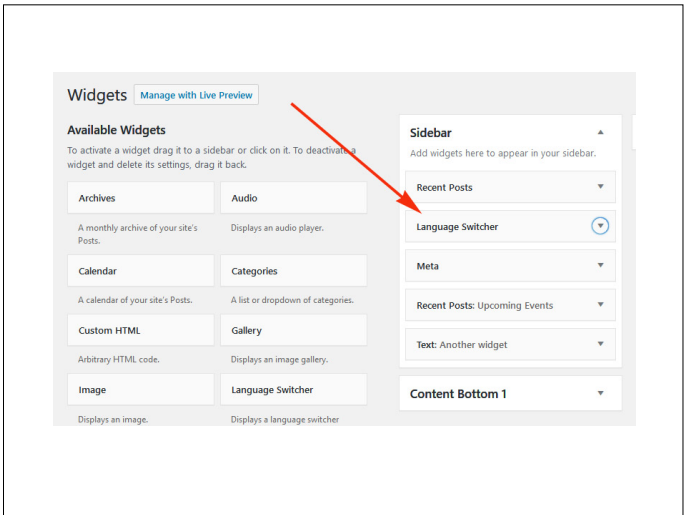
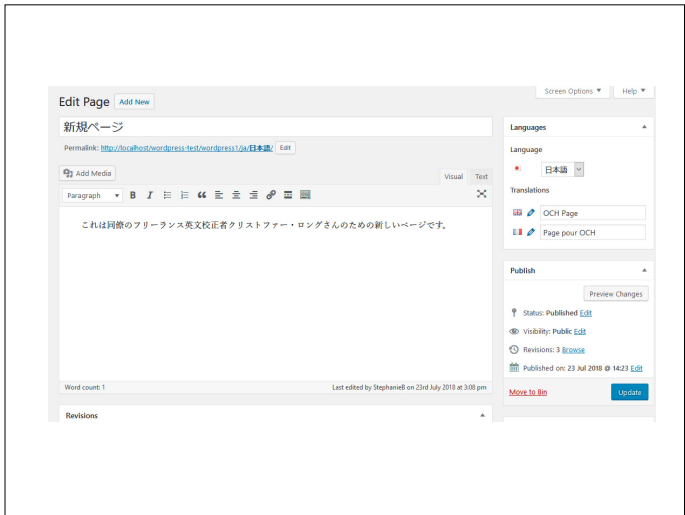
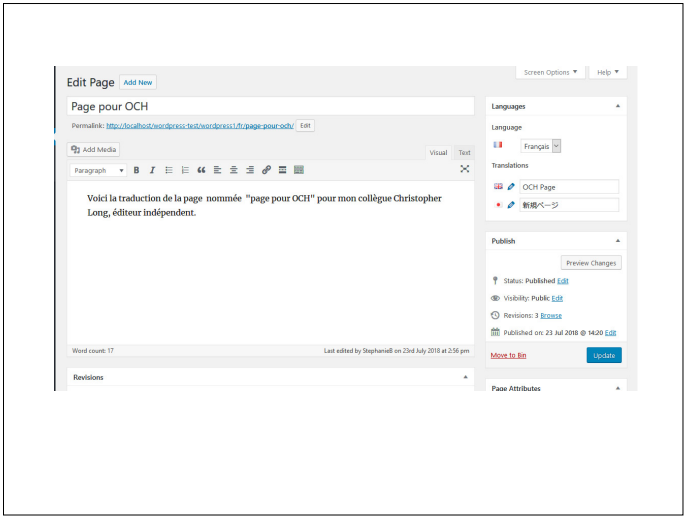
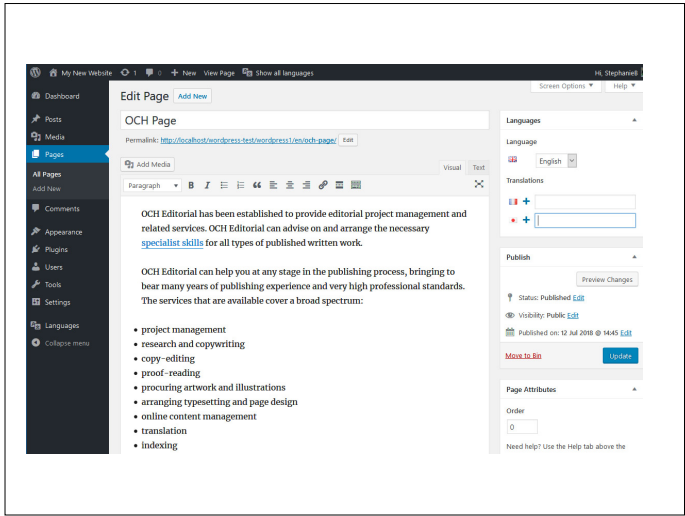
- Polylang, free with paid version

- Weglot

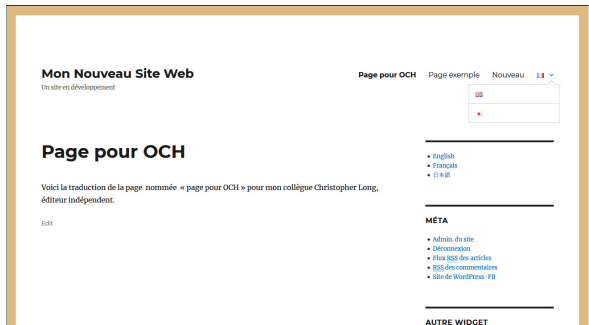
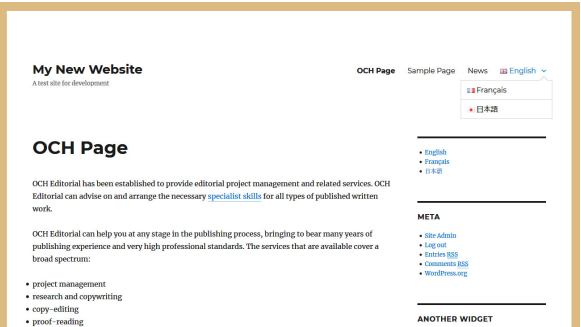
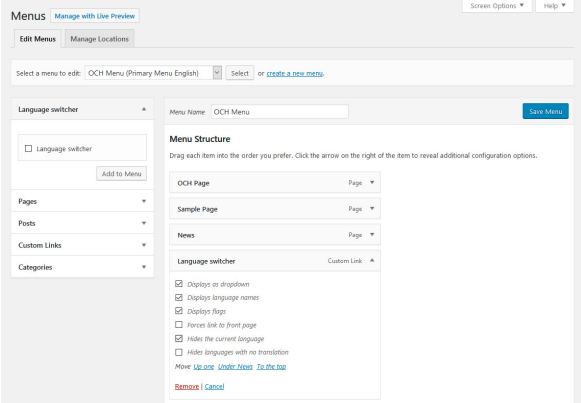
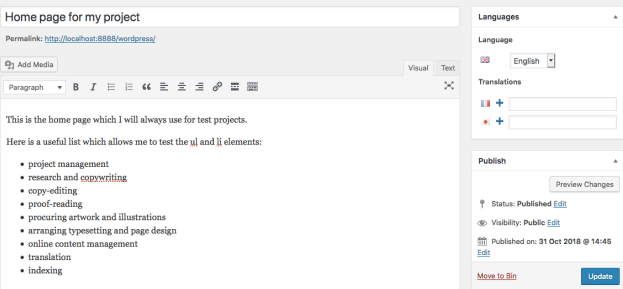
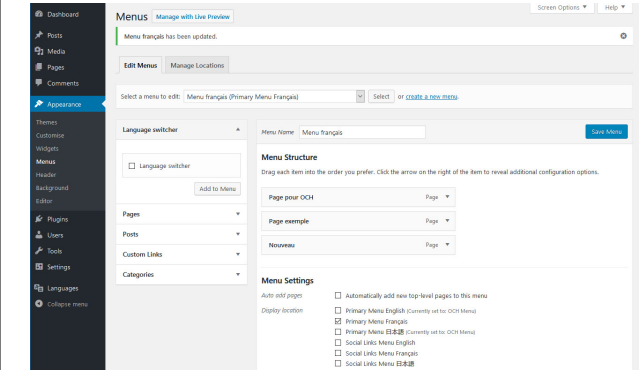
